### Calendar/Schedule Changes Semester 1

- 🐻 School reopening 4 days per week (Monday - Thursday)
- 🐻 Friday used for off-site learning (instructional materials provided)
- 🐻 Holidays will still be observed and days off as previously scheduled
- 🐻 Fridays will be used by staff for teacher office hours, planning for following week, professional development, deeper cleaning.
- 🐻 Elementary: Students will leave the classroom for lunch, physical education, restroom use and recess. All movement from the classroom will meet physical distancing requirements and/or require the use of face coverings.
- 🐻 MS/HS: Passing times between classes will require the use of face coverings by all staff and students. Lunch schedules will be staggered to allow for physical distancing and sanitation.
- 🐻 All Schools: To provide for less exposure to potential virus spread student movement through the building will be minimized and adjusted as deemed necessary.

**THESE CHANGES WILL BE REVIEWED BEFORE THE END OF SEMESTER 1.**

### Instruction - Traditional Classroom Learning

- 🐻 Students and staff will practice operational safety procedures to reduce the spread of COVID-19.
- 🐻 This school year there will be a focus on social and emotional health for students and staff focusing on inclusion and anxiety reduction.
- 🐻 Introduce the students to the new look of school and classrooms as school starts to create a welcoming environment for learning.
- 🐻 Lean on existing curricular components such as homeroom teachers and advisory periods.
- 🐻 Schedules will be structured to allow for student and staff breaks within a student homeroom model.

### Instruction - Off-Site Learning

- 🐻 To be used in the event of exposure to positive COVID-19 cases, county or state mandated closure.
- 🐻 Allow for fewer instructional interruptions. Anticipated use of this model targeted to buildings or cohorts to address COVID-19 exposure and/or outbreaks.
- 🐻 Families must be prepared for short term building closures without significant notice throughout the school year.
- 🐻 Clear expectations for staff and students

### Individual Off-Site Learning Model

- 🐻 Offered to students and families who wish to learn off-site instead of on campus.
- 🐻 Provide school issued device if needed.
- 🐻 Students will learn online with access to virtual instructor.
- 🐻 Contact school counselor for additional information about this program.

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### Extra Curricular Activities

- As school resumes in a traditional classroom learning environment, clubs and activities will take place with physical distancing and safety measures in place.
- Rely on and implement guidance from WIAA to safely hold athletic practices, competitions and events.
- Activities and events may be postponed or adjusted to meet guidelines and/or current conditions in schools or the community. Some activities may not have spectators.

### Transportation

- Based on guidelines of less than 50% capacity on school buses, students will sit one per seat. Students from the same household will be expected to sit together with two or three per seat.
- All students and staff on buses or other school vehicles will be required to wear face coverings. Students will be expected to provide personal face coverings. Limited disposable face coverings will be available on the bus.
- Multiple drop off or pick up locations must be limited and approved by the administration. Changes to a drop off schedule may not be possible after 2:30 PM. School provided transportation will not be used for personal alternative destinations such as birthday parties, sleepovers, etc.
- Buses will be disinfected following each route with extra attention to high touch areas.

### Food Service

- Students will not use the touchpad for entering lunch numbers. JK-5th grade will have staff input barcodes by class. 6-12th grade students will be provided lunch codes/ID badges for staff scanning.
- Elementary will receive "Grab and Go" breakfast meals in the Elementary Commons as students arrive and meals will be eaten in the classrooms. MS/HS students will eat served items or "Grab and Go" items in their first period, Advisory classroom.
- Elementary students will be served hot lunch in the Elementary Commons. Students will take lunch trays to assigned classrooms to eat. MS/HS students will eat served items in the cafeteria at designated spaces at the tables.

### Health Information

- All staff will wear face coverings when the 6 feet physical distancing isn't possible.
- Students are highly recommended to wear face coverings (mask, bandana, etc.) during the day whenever possible, but specifically will need to during passing times, and in other common use areas of the building when 6 feet physical distancing is not possible such as locker rooms, bathrooms, etc.
- Plexiglass barriers installed in areas involving higher levels of traffic and contact.
- Increased physical distancing/health signage and added sanitation stations.
- No field trips/large group events and limit access to the building for non-students and staff.
- Increased ventilation and disinfecting.
